Meeting Minutes

- 1) **Open Meeting- 6:00 PM**
 - a. The Regular Board of Directors Meeting of April 16, 2024, was called to order at 6:02 PM by President Andy Zody. General Manager, Joseph Tapia led the Pledge of Allegiance. Director David Nilsen led the Invocation.

David Nilsen moved to accept the Bills, Managers Report and Minutes as presented. Luanne Uhl seconded the motion.

Comment by Mr. Barnes regarding meeting minutes and Luanne Uhl's comment regarding her family uses less than one share. He quoted her from the recording and information provided that she owns more than one share. Uhl future explained that she does own more than one share and her family does indeed use less than one share.

- 3) **Open Forum/Public Comment-** Under this item any member of the Board or Public may address the Board on any item relating to the company not listed on this agenda. However, the Board is prohibited under AB 240 from taking any action on an item not appearing on the agenda. Board president will call on each participant and at that time you have three (3) minutes to speak. Please be advised that this meeting will be recorded for documentation purposes and to help the accuracy of the meeting minutes.

1. Nilsen would like to agendize having Arruda to complete all the necessary documents of the compliance order. Once Well #13 is online, we'll have enough Back-up production to complete the necessary documents.
2. Nilsen would like to donate his service and represent Sheep Creek at the San Bernardino County Fair 4-H/FFA animal auction.
3. Nilsen received many phone calls after the Annual May meeting regarding the costs of the legal fees. Nilsen would like to agendize the need to raise the base rate to cover the costs. The legal fees increase from 1) Domain Name, 2) legal questions from shareholders, 3) lawsuit in small claims court in Barstow, SCWC prevailed, 4) ongoing lawsuit in Superior Court, similar to the Barstow claims.

Nilsen would like to be transparent about ongoing costs and the need to increase our budget line for legal fees.

4. John Kimminau – asked questions regarding who and how the allotment was determined. Discussion followed on how and who determines the allotment – The shareholder vote, based on production and usage, based on state law, based on Maximum Day Demand.
5. Peter Barnes – mentioned the \$50k spent on the letter sent to the State. Barnes is confused as to why the letter was sent. Barnes claims he spoke with someone from the State and SCWC can do what they want with those meters. Board anticipated the cost might be \$50k, but it was far less than that.

Barnes wanted to define the Max Day Demand.

Barnes spoke about the SCWC votes at the Annual Shareholders meeting and who has the voting power.

1) Peter Barnes – Comments followed. 8.08 SCWC Bylaws – discussion regarding water shares and water portion. Mr. Barnes announced he filed a lawsuit against the company and encouraged other Shareholders to join him.

- 2) Vince Rifino – Share allotment. Would like to hear about the allotment and why the shares have not yet been brought back to equal allotments. Nilsen mentioned SCWC followed the Corrective Order and maximum day demand. The State reviews Max Day Demand from the past 10 years. Even though SCWC can produce 2,000 GPM and if in 2 years we have another drought, and SCWC can't meet the MDD, the state will step in again. Nilsen mentioned the Shareholder Allotment Options for today's vote to equalize allotments to the same amount for Tier 1 and our backup Wells for Teir 2. SCWC met with all the actions in the Corrective Order. Zody reported on his home rain meter and measurements.
- 3) Ingrid Stinchcomb – Love our community and does not think it's a good idea to sue the company. Believes it hurts everyone. Lawsuits are meant to divide and are costly and use up resources in a negative way. Keep the water company private and continue to service as it has been.
- 4) John Burcher – Family is from Lancaster, and he is from Wrightwood. He is concerned about mining resources and drilling deep into our ground. Encourage with other Water Boards and move water down from Mt. Shasta.
- 5) James Watson – Loves the Water Company and does want to see anything happen to the company. Most water comes from the snowpack, not rain. Pray for snow more than rain. Lawsuit, win or lose, every Shareholder will need to pay. Strongly against any lawsuits.
- 6) Robert Howard – Former board member for 15 years. Lifelong residence in Phelan. SCWC has had ups and downs with water production. Our community has always come together. What Aggravates Mr. Howard the most is the lawsuit, it hurts everybody. Believes that Barnes has alternative motives. Stated that at the last Shareholder meeting he asked Barnes what his plans were, and Barnes had no answer.
- 7) Andy Zody- For the record, a Master Plan is required by the SWRCB.

Jim Watson moved to accept the Annual Meeting Minutes 2023. Al Parker seconded the motion. Motion carried.

b. System Update

President Zody provided an overview of our system update to include information on company upgrades, production, and the increase in the price of goods. He talked about Well #13 waiting on Edison to hook up electricity to the Well.

IV. **New Business**

Action Items will be voted by shareholders.

Board of Directors recommends the approval of the below Action Item

**If GPM Drops to 1500 GPM the allotment would return to
750 CU FT/150 CU FT until GPM is over 1800 GPM**

a.) Shareholder Allotment Options

Option I:

Leave the allotment at the present 750 CU FT for the first share and 150 CU FT for each additional share that the shareholder owns. Pay for Well #13 from Tier 3.

Option II:

Change the Tier I allotment to 600 CU FT for all shares. Increase the allotment for Tier 2 to 300 CU FT for all shares. Would go into effect only a) once Well 13 is approved by the State Water Resource Control Board and operating, and b) subject to any necessary State approval.

If voting for Option II, choose from one of the following rate options:

Choose One:

Choice 1:

Increase the base rate from the present \$70 per month to \$77 per month, for Well # 13.

Or,

Choice 2:

Increase all the water rates by 25%.

Or,

Choice 3:

Have \$30.00 semi-annually (2x per year) assessments per share.

Comments from Shareholders (summarized)

Peter Barnes – Who owns the water? The water is owned by the shareholders. Mr. Barnes has an issue with the process of how SCWC is moving. He proposes amending the Bylaws to add additional definitions – clarity to back-up Wells. Vote every share to have the same amount of water. Shareholder vote is not enough to take away the rights that are given to the Shareholders. States why are we doing shareholder votes? They do not count in a court of law, it will not matter. Thinks we should amend the articles of incorporation and the By-Laws, otherwise this is useless. Happy about allotment allocation, that is why he filed the lawsuit, however believes SCWC still needs to pay.

b.) Approval of Proposed New Master Plan

Board Member Nilsen summarized the proposed new Master Plan. Mr. Nilsen mentioned SCWC has been working on the Master Plan for over 5 years. Most of the work was done during the consolidation efforts. 1) Grants, 2) Increase budget about 25%, 3) The Board will always bring all options and issues to the shareholders for their vote, 4) If a developer comes into town the developer will pay the bill for all the upgrades needed (like Rite Aid).

V. Election of SCWC Board of Directors

- Shareholder Jim Watson nominated the current Board of Directors and second by Justin Hendersen.
- Sharon Barnes nominated Peter Barnes. No second.

Ingrid Stinchcomb moved for a unanimous vote because the nominations were for the existing board. Al Parker second the motion.

Zody asked the shareholder to Raise their hand in agreement. No count of hands was taken, overwhelming hands were raised.

Zody called for a Voice Vote – Motion Carried.

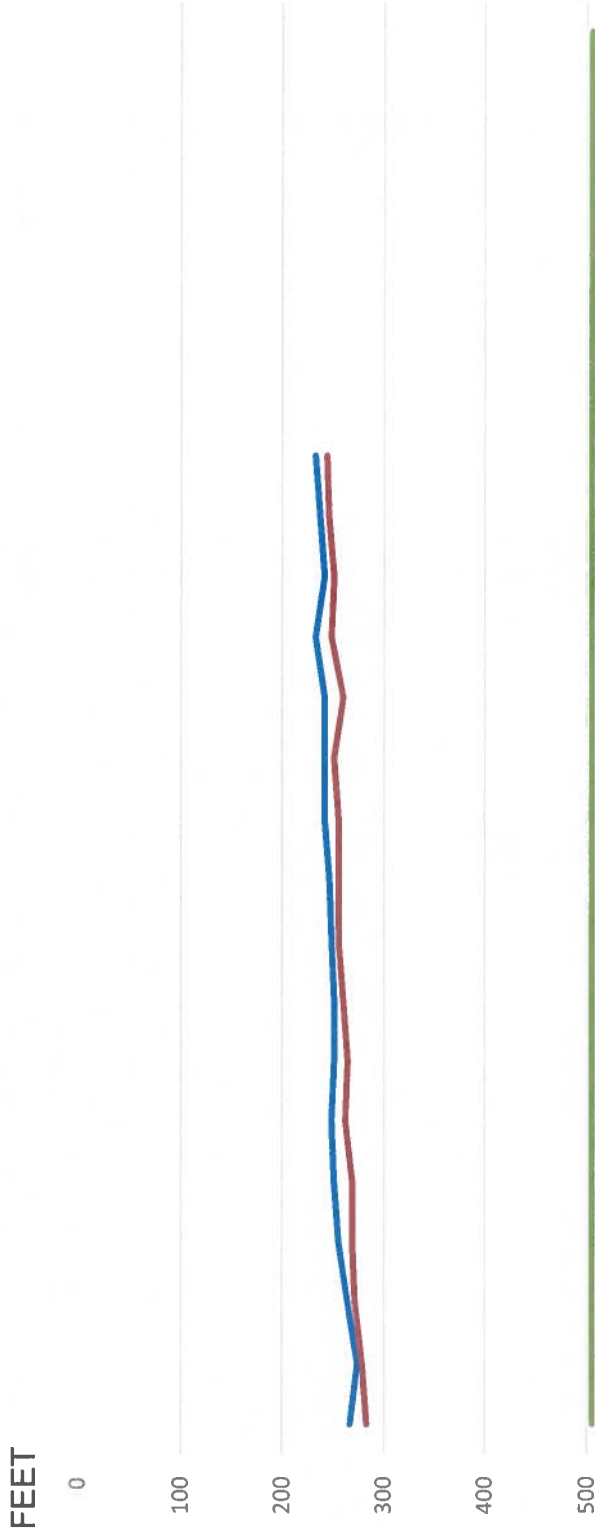

WELL #2A Monthly Water Levels / 2 years



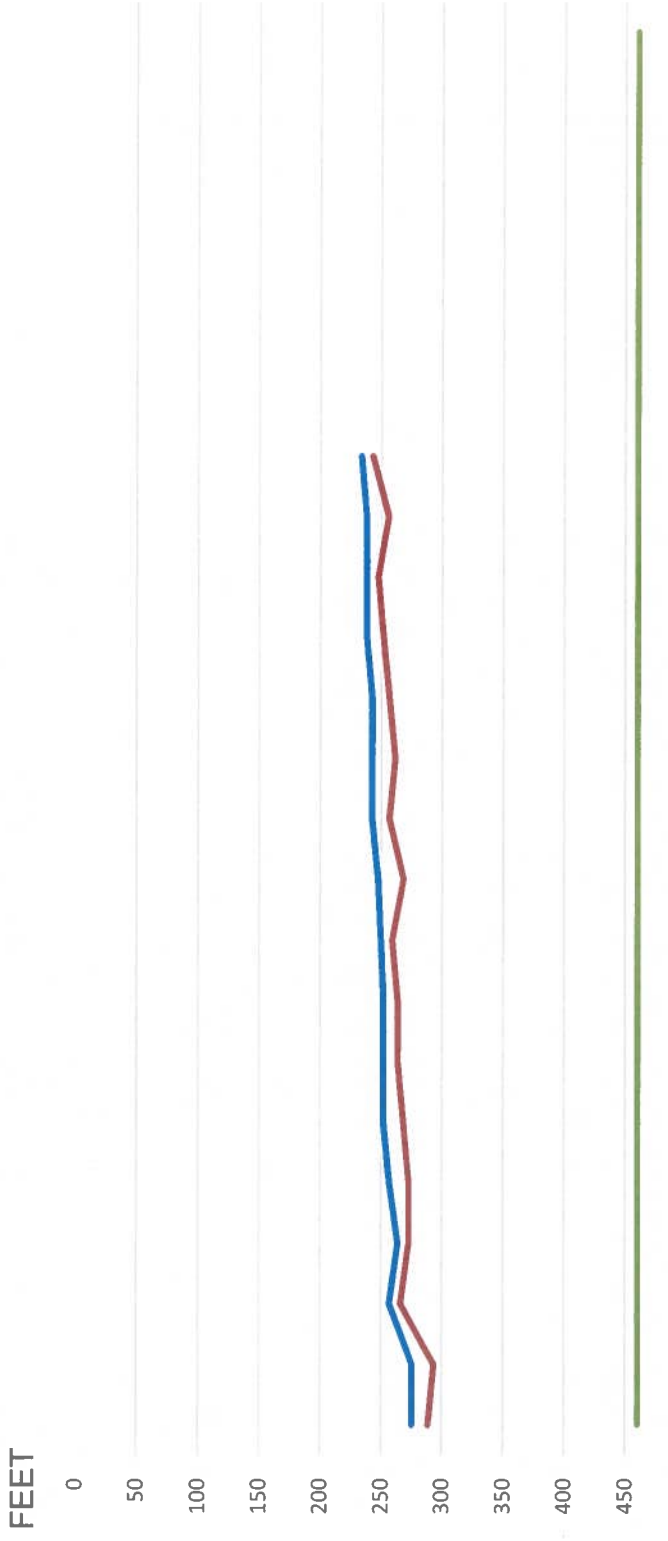

WELL #3A Monthly Water Levels / 2 years



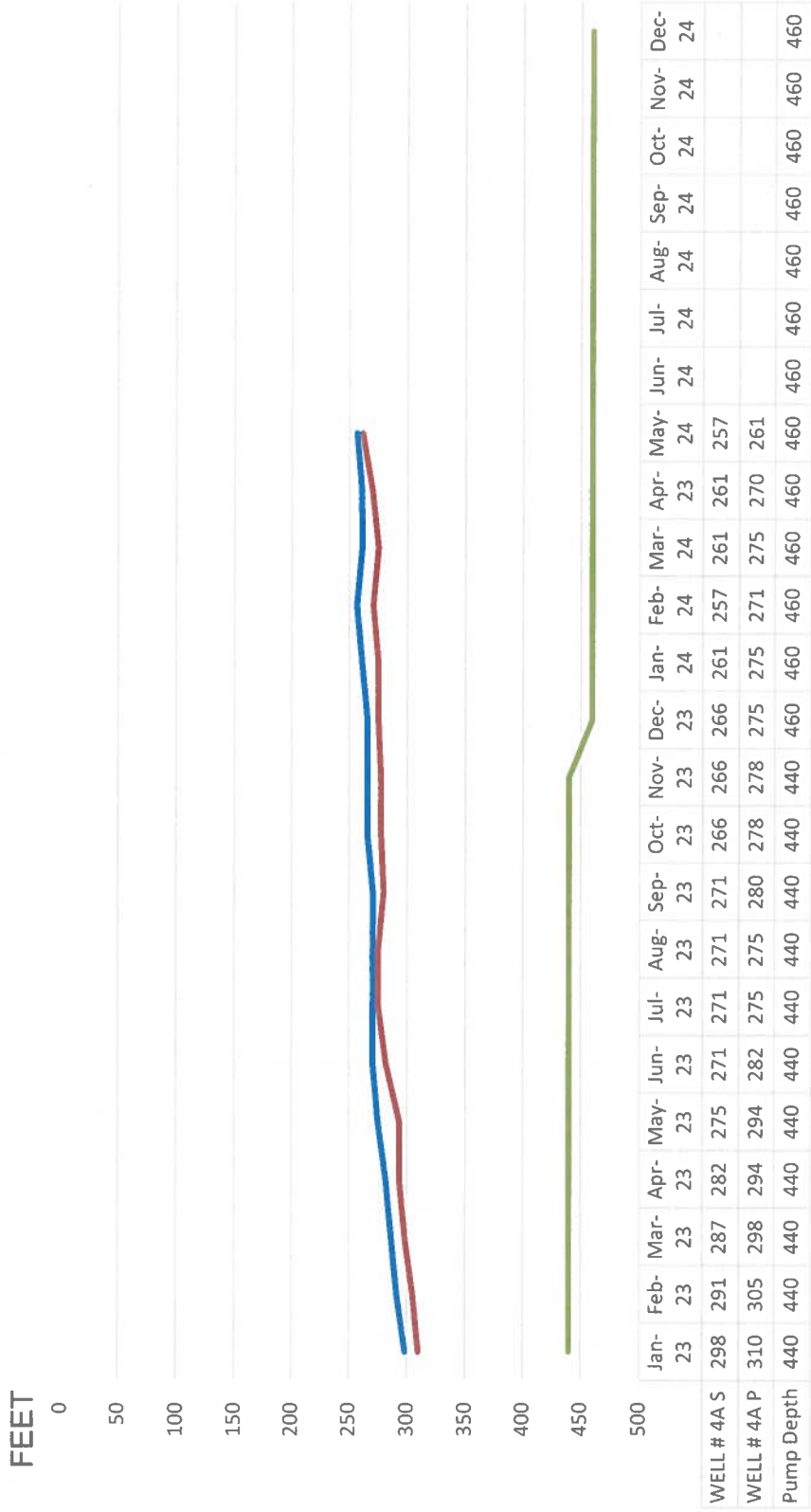

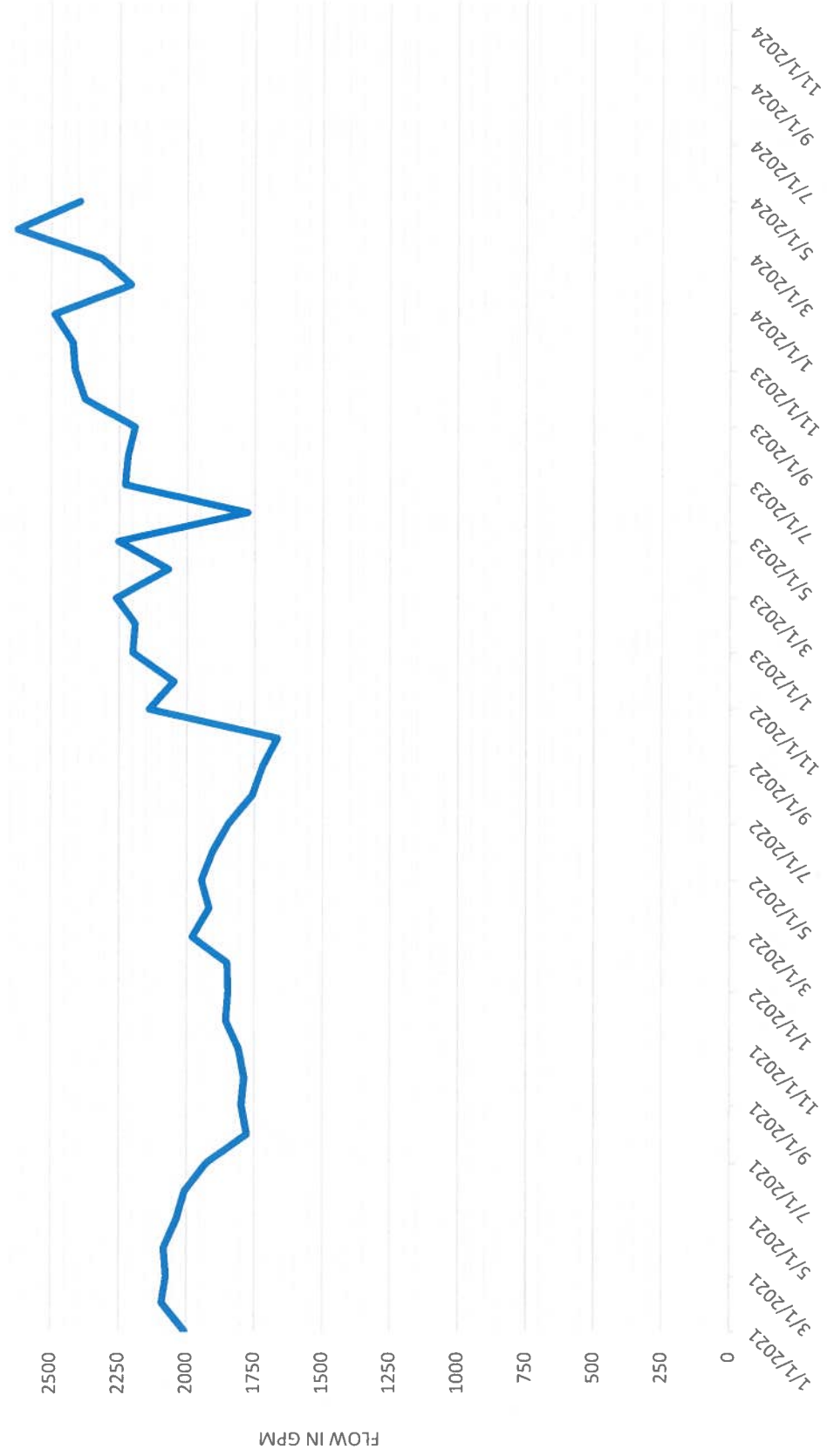

Tunnel Flow

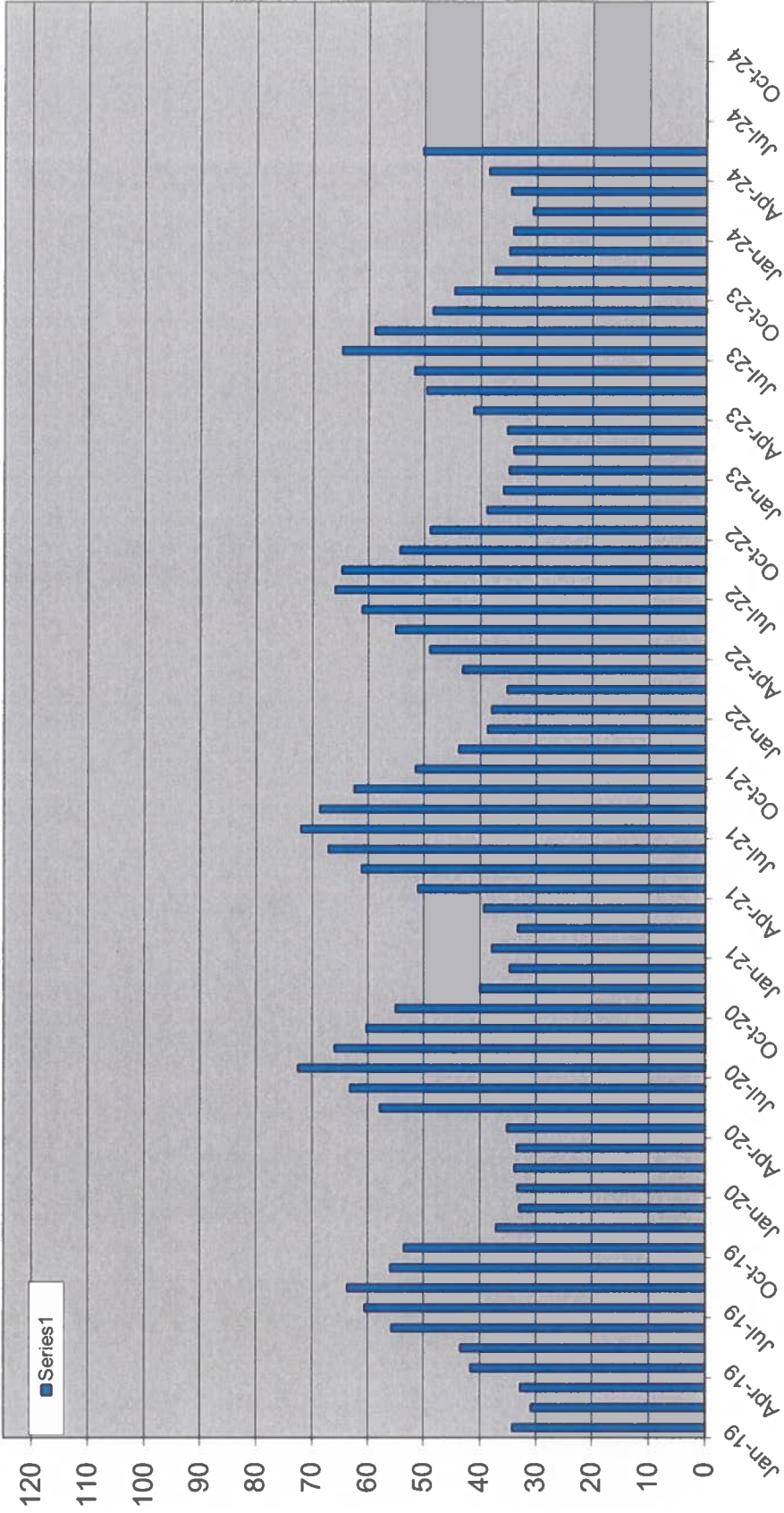
